Dr. Vanessa Perotti is an Australian-trained neurosurgeon with expertise in brain, spine, and nerve conditions. She treats a wide range of issues, including back and neck pain, sciatica, spinal injuries, brain and spinal tumours, and nerve disorders. She completed her medical training at the University of Sydney and has worked in major hospitals across NSW, New Zealand, the US, and Germany.

Dr. Perotti holds a Fellowship with the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons and has advanced training in spinal surgery and trauma care, particularly for injured workers and those in rural and remote areas.

Passionate about providing well-rounded care, she works closely with physiotherapists, pain specialists, and rehab teams to help patients recover fully and safely. Dr. Perotti is also active in teaching, research, and improving healthcare safety.

MBBS, MSpMed, FRACS (Orth), FAOrthA

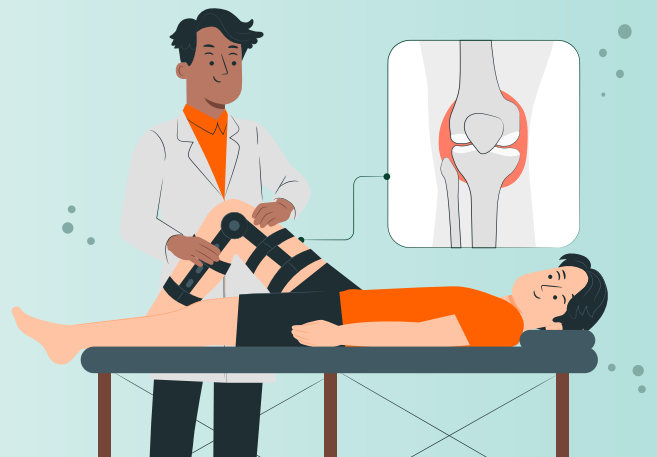
